Hand Dyed Yarn Design by Julia Bauer



Seabird

Seabird is a triangular, asymmetric shawllette which is knit in one piece. The whole garment is knit in garter stitch. Its size can be adjusted easily. Gauge is not so critical. This design works perfectly with hand-dyed multicolor yarn. One of the two wave-borders is formed while knitting the body of the shawl. The pattern is super easy to remember and makes the shawllette a great "handbag" project. The second border is made in the last step by adding small waves. This is also easy and can be skipped if you're running out of yarn.

Finished Measurements

150 cm (59") x 28 cm (11")

Yarn

150 g fingering weight yarn
with 525 m per 150 g (350 - 400 m / 100 g)

Yarn suggestions

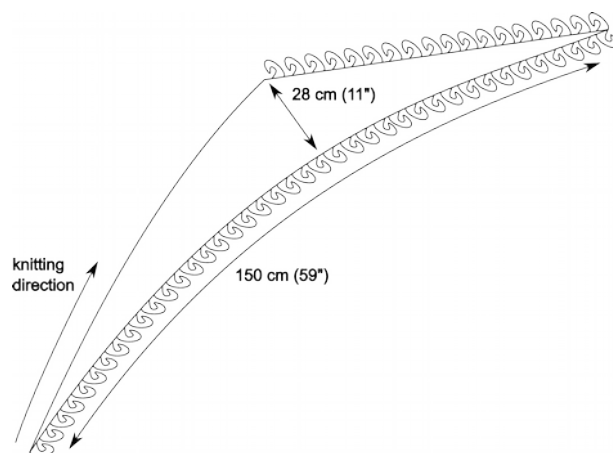
- Wollmeise – Pure (1 skein)
- Dye for Yarn – Fingering MerinoSilk (2 skeins)
- Dye for Yarn – Fingering MerinoCamel (2 skeins)
- FadenFreundin – Something Beautiful (1-2 skeins)

Needles & Notions

- One 60 cm (24") circular knitting needle in size 3,5 mm (US 4)
- Tapestry needle
- Blocking pins and / or blocking wire

Gauge

23 st x 54 rows in garter stitch



Abbreviations

k	knit
st	stitch(es)
k2tog	knit two st together
kfb	knit into front and back of st (the number of st is increased by one)
w&t	wrap the yarn around the next st, turn the work (bring yarn to front of work between needles, slip next stitch to right-hand needle, bring yarn around this stitch to back of work, slip stitch back to left-hand needle, turn work to begin knitting back in the other direction)
pw	pick the wrap (knit to wrapped stitch. Slip next stitch from left needle to right needle, use tip of left needle to pick up "wrap" and place it on right needle, insert left needle into both wrap and stitch, knit them together)
CO	Cast on
BO	Bind off

Directions

CO 5 stitches.

Set-Up Row 0: k all st.

Pattern

Row 1: k1, kfb, k to 2 st before end,
kfb, kfb;

Row 2: k to 2 st before end, kfb, k1;

Row 3-10: Repeat row 1-2 for 4 more
times. You knit 10 rows.

Row 11: k1, kfb, k to 2 st before end,
kfb, kfb;

Row 12: BO 4 st, *k2tog, BO 1 st,* (repeat
from * to * for 7 times), k to 2 st
before end, kfb, k1;
(increased by 6 st.)

Repeat row 1-12 until you have 20% of
your yarn left. Then knit the wave border
pattern.



If you don't like to knit the second wave border or
you are running out of yarn, you could skip the
second wave-border. With 10% of yarn left, knit
one last pattern repeat, ending on row 11.

Row 12 (BO Row): BO 4 st, *k2tog, BO 1 st,*
(repeat from * to * for 7 times), BO all st.

Wave border pattern

When you knit the desire length and/or
you have 20% of your yarn left end after
row 12.

With one skein of Wollmeise Pure i got 24 waves,
then I started with the second wave border.

Setup rows:

Row 0.1: k to 2 st before end, kfb, kfb;

Row 0.2: k4, w&t;

Continue with the following pattern:

Row 1: k2, kfb, kfb;

Row 2: k6, pw, w&t;

Row 3: k5, kfb, kfb;

Row 4: k9, pw, w&t;

Row 5: k8, kfb, kfb;

Row 6: k12, pw, w&t;

Row 7: k11, kfb, kfb;

Row 8: k15, pw, w&t;

Row 9: k14, kfb, kfb;

Row 10: k18, pw, w&t;

Row 11: k17, kfb, kfb;

Row 12: BO 4 st, *k2tog, BO 1 st,* (repeat
from * to * for 7 times), k 2, pw, w&t;

Repeat row 1-12 until you have 6 or less
st left (counting the st after w&t gap in
row 12). In the last row 12 keep BO all st
without turning the work.

Row 12 (BO Row): BO 4 st, *k2tog, BO 1 st,*
(repeat from * to * for 7 times), BO all st.

Finishing

Weave in all ends, wash and block shawl
to finished measurements.
